PRESERVATION NEWS EXPANDED LIVING HISTORY CAMPUS

~ PRESIDENT'S LETTER FALL 2019 ~



Fall is here and we have an action packed event line up for all to enjoy. Read about Mount Harmon upcoming events and programs in this newsletter and visit our website at www. mountharmon.org to learn more. You won't want to miss our fall and holiday events, including our much anticipated National Revolutionary War Reenactment Festival October 12 & 13. Bring friends and family and be sure to join us for this very special event! Follow Mount Harmon on social media for updated news and information.

We are very excited to announce the debut of our replica Slave Quarters, the 3rd and final colonial building project on MHP's expanded Living History Campus. After more than 6 years of planning, the smoke house, tobacco barn, and replica slave quarters serve to tell a much fuller history of Mount Harmon's colonial era. These plantation outbuildings give visitors a glimpse into Maryland's "Golden Age" of the Tobacco Trade, and the growth and wealth generated by agriculture, trade and export, and indentured and enslaved labor.

With the growth and expansion of the tobacco trade from the Chesapeake also came the complicated story of Slavery and the enslaved people that built our young nation. MHP has teamed up with Dr. Kami Fletcher, Professor of African American studies and Alexa Silver, Professor of American History at Delaware State University to help research and better tell MHP's role in the Slave trade and more importantly, the stories of the people who made Mount Harmon and our young nation prosper. Stay tuned as we continue to further develop and share Mount Harmon's slave and plantation history with our visitors.

The MHP Colonial Outbuilding Project was conceived in the spring of 2012. After establishing the most relevant colonial buildings to bring Mount Harmon's plantation history to life, the project was underway! Building design, grant funding, and construction were crucial elements to the project. With all the planning behind us, it was time to find an artisan builder that shared the same vision, skill and passion necessary to bring the project to life. The perfect person for the job ahead was McGuirk Restoration Inc. owned and operated by Derek McGuirk of Bel Air, Maryland.



At 8 years old, with a woodworking kit Derek received for Christmas from his parents, his lifelong passion for woodworking, timber framing and restoration was off and running! In 1972 Derek bought an old axe and timber adze for \$20. His first big project was to rebuild the spring house on his family's farm in Bel Air. Derek's passion for old tools and pictures from the Eric Sloan "Vanishing Landscape" books, were pivotal in his pursuit of a career in restoration and timber framing. Derek has built and restored many old buildings including a replica log barn in which he cut and hand hewn all the timbers and rafters himself. Using antique trim molding wood planes to recreate period molding is something Derek does well and has implemented in the buildings at MHP. Derek has built all 3 of our outbuildings over the last 5 years. Starting with the smoke house in 2014, the tobacco barn in 2017, and the slave dwelling in 2019. One visitor remarked that Derek's buildings are not simply buildings, but "works of art". The buildings are simple in design but very complex in regards to the detailed elements of construction and craftsmanship.



Along with woodworking Derek enjoys Bluegrass Music, playing the banjo, fishing, shaker furniture and spending time with his wife Susan and their 3 children! Many thanks to Derek for sharing his incredible talents with MHP!! Please stop by and see these wonderful "works of art" on our expanded Colonial Living History campus this fall. Finally, please consider MHP in your year end giving plans. Your support, memberships, and donations are very important to the success of MHP and keeping this Maryland Tidewater treasure preserved, maintained, and open for all to enjoy.
